cattle after their kind, and every-thing that creepeth upon the ground after its kind: and God saw that it was good. 26 And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the heavens, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth. 27 And God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. 28 And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the heavens, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth. 29 And God said, Behold, I have given you every herb yielding seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in which is the fruit of a tree, yielding seed; to you it shall be for food: 30 and to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the heavens, and to everything that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for food: and it was so. 31 And God saw everything that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day. 2 And the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. 2 And on the seventh day God finished his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. 3 And God blessed the seventh day, and hallowed it; because that in it he rested from all his work which God had created and made. 4 These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that Jê-hô'vâh God made earth and heaven. 5 And no plant of the field was yet in the earth, and no herb of the field had yet sprung:

for Jê-hô'vâh God had not caused it to rain upon the earth; and there was not a man to till the ground: 6 but there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground. 7 And Jê-hô'vâh God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul. 8 And Jê-hô'vâh God planted a garden eastward, in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed. 9 And out of the ground made Jê-hô'vâh God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. 10 And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became four heads. 11 The name of the first is Pî-shôn: that is it which compasseth the whole land of Hâvî-lâh, where there is gold; 12 and the gold of that land is good: there is bdellium, and the onyx stone. 13 And the name of the second river is Gî'hôn: the same is it that compasseth the whole land of Cush. 14 And the name of the third river is Hîid' dè-kèl: that is it which goeth in front of As-sûr'i-a. And the fourth river is the Eû-phrà'tes. 15 And Jê-hô'vâh God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it. 16 And Jê-hô'vâh God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: 17 but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die. 18 And Jê-hô'vâh God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helpmeet for him. 19 And out of the ground Jê-hô'vâh God formed every beast of the field, and every bird of the heavens; and brought them unto the man to see what he would call them: and whatsoever
